Program Overview

What Do We Do?

- Utilize evidence-based practices to deliver preventionbased services
- Designed to be delivered to children in the school setting (K-12) during school hours
- Provides parent education and engagement groups
- Professional development and psycho-education for teachers and school administrators
- Integrative health care and coordinate full-spectrum health and mental health needs

TIER Process

Children are screened by a licensed clinician using the Strengths and Difficulties Questionaire (SDQ)

Based on the SDQ score
 child/youth is designated to
 Tier 1, Tier 2, or Tier 3

TIER 1: Monitoring, Care as usual, Provide resources, Educational presentations

TIER 2: Prevention programming based on child's need

TIER 3: Referral to specialized providers within Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWIHN)

Referral Process

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- Step 1: Child is identified and referred for screening
- Step 2: Eligibility screening via SDQ is conducted and determines intervention
- Step 3: Children who score within TIER 1 can receive monitoring and care as usual

measures

Step 4: Children who score within TIER 2 can receive prevention-based

programming and resources

Step 5: Children who score within
 TIER 3 can receive a referral to a
 community mental health
 (CMH) provider

Once Enrolled

- Services are delivered **virtually** and face-to-face with students
- Sessions are generally once per week (20 to 45 minutes) during school hours

Parental/legal guardian consent is required
