DWPHN Partners with Local Law Enforcement for National Prescription Take Back Day

OCTOBER 20, 2021- DETROIT MI- Unused prescription drugs in the wrong hands, often ends in tragedy. According to the 2019 National Survey on Drug Use and Health, 9.7 million people misused prescription pain relievers, 4.9 million people misused prescription stimulants. The study also stated that the majority of misused prescription drugs were obtained from family and friends, often from the home medicine cabinet.

The Detroit Wayne Integrated Health Network (DWPHN) in partnership with the Detroit Police Department, Wayne State Police Department, City of Detroit Health Department and community partners - is proud to sponsor and support National Prescription Take Back Day.
