

# DWIHN CRSP MEETING RECAP TUESDAY, MAY 11, 2021 – 1:00 P.M. TO 2:15 P.M.

# 1. Authorizations Updates:

Authorizations for June 1<sup>st</sup> are being entered into the system for approval. Individuals that have a HAB Waiver are eligible for the T2027 code, which is the overnight code. Authorizations being submitted must be within the appropriate timeframe of 24-hours of service per day.

As of 5/12/21, the United Horizon facility will no longer have a contract with DWIHN. They were one of our CLS facilities that had almost 240 members in a semi-independent living/or in an outpatient service. A list of providers was given to the CRSPs so members could choose a new CLS provider of their choice. The majority of members have been transitioned.

# 2. Crisis Services Updates:

Inpatient Psychiatric Prevention and Reduction Plan Committee Sub-groups - A description of the sub-groups was reviewed and discussed. The committee is developing action steps and recommendations to prevent and reduce inpatient psychiatric readmissions. Five subgroups have been established with a facilitator for each group. Crisis Contacts - The CRSP providers were asked to review the Crisis Contact list updated as of 3/31/21. # 3. Quality Improvement Updates:

Critical/Sentinel Events Trainings will be held on 5/20/21, 6/17/21 and 7/15/2. It is important to submit and upload supporting documentation when entering critical sentinel events into the system before it can be submitted to the state.

### 4. Medicaid Claims Verification Reviews:

As a part of DWIHN's contractual obligations with MDHHS, we are required to conduct an encounter claims verification review of our network. To ensure that paid claims and the rendered services are appropriately documented in the members record.

The reviews are completed twice a year by the Quality departments staff. The first half of the fiscal year is from  $4/1^{st} - 7/31^{st}$  and the service months reviewed during that period is October 1, 2020 - March 31, 2021. The second half of the fiscal year is from August – October  $31^{st}$  and the service months reviewed during the period is  $4/1 - 9/30^{th}$ .



Due to COVID-19, the Quality Department is requesting organizations to upload the proof of documentation into MH-WIN's message box or arrange to have the documents drop off at DWIHN with the assigned QI staff. A letter was sent to providers with the instructions on how to complete this request. The training will be held on Tuesday, June 8, 2021 from 1:00 p.m. to 2:30 p.m. MDHHS facilitators are Mr. Price Pullins, Chief Psychologist and Ms. Charlyss Ray, Licensed Occupational Therapist.

# 5. Detroit at Work Project:

DWIHN and Detroit@Work which is the city of Detroit's Employment program are partnering to help find employment and to connect people to mental health resources. The pilot is through the city of Detroit and they help people search and apply for employment opportunities. They have nine different career centers throughout the city and it's for the residents of Detroit.

All of the locations are within 3 miles of the career centers and are very accessible. They support about 3,500 residents a year with career opportunities, occupational training and high school completion.

As a part of the partnership with Detroit@Work, additional support for behavioral health services will be available to connect people to Detroit Wayne and our Provider network. This will not only assist with jobs skills for employment opportunities it will also provide support with behavioral health services as well.
