Engage-Joanna Lofton: Ms. Lofton indicated that the Engage Action Group is still soliciting toiletry items for distribution to persons involuntarily involved in human trafficking. Nicole Gowan recently took an inventory of what is left over after the last distribution of care packages. She stated that currently the group has enough toiletry items to package only about 15 kits. She said that there is a lot of shampoo and conditioner left over. Ms. Lofton stated that she recently obtained 100 toothbrushes and tubes of toothpaste from her dentist. There are plans to package 100 more toiletry item care packages for distribution at Nicole Gowan's house on November 20, 2021. Plans are to deliver the new care packages to trafficked persons around Thanksgiving. It was stated that L. Johnson and Deb Monroe should be consulted about organizations where we can distribute the care packages. Attempts are being made to obtain the bags that the packages are placed in for free from the vendor. The vendor said he will provide the kits as we need them. Currently they are being provided at a reduced price. Mr. Shaw has been tasked to update the toiletry items flyer. He will send it out for distribution soon. In the future, the Engage Action Group would like to work on countering domestic violence, obtaining more guest speakers, obtaining more informational videos, encouraging community members to resolve conflicts at home, providing information about stranger/danger and information about how to keep children and seniors safe, possibly adopting a family and providing them gifts for the Christmas holiday, and adopting a senior. Ms. Burton will take the lead on adopt a senior.

Advise-Ray Schuholz: Mr. Schuholz was not able to present his update so it was tabled.

Empower-Michael Squirewell: Mr. Squirewell noted that "Reaching for the Stars" was a success. It was planned and executed by the Empower Action Group of which he is the chairperson. Ms. Nelson and Ms. Burton indicted at the last Empower Action Group meeting that they would like to select new colors for the next "Reaching for the Stars" event. Mr. Squirewell stated that Cynthia Monia wants to crochet masks and give them for distribution with the care packages that the Engage Action Group plans to distribute.

Advocacy-Margaret Keyes Howard. The Advocacy Action Group plans to conduct another voting initiative at AFC Homes in November 2021.
