DWIHN Crisis Continuum Recommendations

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1.Inpatient hospitalization

- Longer length of stay when medically supported
- 2. Crisis Services
 - Care Centers with CSU and CRU
 - Mobile Crisis

- 3. Residential Services
 - Expand Specialized AFC homes
- 4. Wellness Living



- CRISIS CARE CENTER- MILWAUKEE AVE WITH 39 BEDS:
 - CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT- Treatment up to 72 hours. 24/7 Walk-in/police drop offs.
 - CRISIS RESIDENTIAL UNITS- Treatment up to 14day voluntary alternative to hospitalization.
 - TRANSITIONAL PROGRAM- Treatment up to 7day, emergency step-down program for individuals transitioning to longer term AFC or housing.



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CRISIS CARE CENTER – DOWNRIVER – 20 Beds

- CRISIS STABILIZATION UNIT- Treatment up to 72 hours. 24/7 Walk-in/police drop offs.
- CRISIS RESIDENTIAL UNITS- Treatment up to 14-day voluntary alternative to hospitalization.
- TRANSITIONAL PROGRAM- Treatment up to 7-day, emergency step-down program for individuals transitioning to longer term AFC or housing.



Continuum of Care Recommendations Inpatient Hospitalization

- Expansion of inpatient beds in Detroit and Wayne County
 - Meets the medical criteria for Inpatient stay and Length of Stay can go above the 14 days
 - Adult Short-Term Inpatient Psychiatric Unit. 32-bed unit which will provide a short-term mental health services for clients requiring inpatient care with an average length of stay of 5-7 days.
 - Detroit:
 - ▶ 52 bed free-standing inpatient psychiatric facility through public/private partnership.
 - 20-bed long term unit in private setting will provide an individualized care for patients that need long term psychiatric hospitalization in excess of 45 days.
 - Wayne County:
 - ▶ 108 bed free-standing inpatient psychiatric facility.
 - Long term unit in private setting will provide an individualized care for patients that need long term psychiatric hospitalization in excess of 45 days.
 - Public/Private Partnership Funding \$6 million
 - Out-Wayne County location Funding Request \$106 million

Continuum of Care Recommendation Law Enforcement Partnership

► POLICE CO-RESPONSE

- ▶ 3,805 encounters (Jan. 2022- Dec. 2022)
- ► CRISIS INTERVENTION TEAM (CIT) TRAINING
 - > 243 police officers trained (Jan. 2022- Dec. 2022)
- Co Response: Providing Wrap Around Support Staff:
 - ► Funding \$ 3,368,031
- CIT- Train 20% of sworn officers
 - ► Funding \$ 360,000 for training 600 Officers
- Crisis Response Training: Funds will be allocated to train sworn officers of the Detroit Police Department.
 - ▶ Funding \$734,800





Continuum of Care Recommendation Detroit Housing and Residential Services

- Expand services into City of Detroit's Supported housing initiative to embed physical and behavioral health services through DWIHN into 230 units.
- Expand existing Specialized Residential AFC Licensed beds
 - ▶ 60 short term beds
 - 60 long term beds for acute patients
- Funding \$5 million



Continuum of Care Recommendation Holistic Health Program / Resource Center

- Develop a program based on Boston Healthcare for the Homeless Program:
 - ►Integrated medical and behavioral services
 - ► Case Management
 - ► Recovery Services
 - ▶ Preventative Health Services
 - ► Housing Assistance and Resource Center
 - ► Establishes "Psychiatric Urgent Care"
- Community-Based Outpatient Treatment Services:
 - Shared living environment
 - Independent living units
- Funding \$50 Million



- Adolescents aging out of Youth Foster Care
- o Offering behavioral health interventions
- for families connecting them with programs and services.
- Ability to serve as a hub for satellite offices across all municipalities.



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
